What Does it Mean to be a Christian?

Most people live their entire lives without ever knowing "WHY?" They exist year after year with no idea of why they are alive or God's purpose for their lives. The most basic question a person can ask is "Why am I here?"

Everyone wants to be fulfilled. People try many ways

- ...Some look for fulfillment by acquiring possessions
- ...Some look for fulfillment by experiencing pleasure
- ...Some look for fulfillment by gaining prestige and power

But real fulfillment comes from understanding your purpose.

Why am I Here?

1. God made me for His purpose and pleasure.

"I will say to the north, Give up, and to the south, Do not withhold; bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the end of the earth, everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made." (Isaiah 43:6-7, ESV)

"You are worthy, O Lord our God, to receive glory and honor and power. For you created everything, and it is for your pleasure that they exist and were created." (Revelation 4:11, NLT)

2. God created me to find ultimate satisfaction in one source - Him!

"Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart." (Psalm 37:4, NIV)

"Whom have I in heaven but you? And there is nothing on earth that I desire besides you. My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever." (Psalm 73:24-25, ESV)

"Jesus said to them, 'I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst.'" (John 6:35, ESV)

3. God created me so that I will bring glory to Him.

"So God created human beings, making them in His image." (Genesis 1:27, GNB)

"So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God." (1 Corinthians 10:31, ESV)

If this is the kind of life God intends for us to have, why aren't most people really fulfilled?

What is the Problem?

Man has a natural desire for control and to ignore God's principles for living.

Examples: "Look out for #1"

"If it feels good, do it!"

"It's my life and I'll do what I please!"

"Do your own thing!"

THE BIBLE CALLS THIS ATTITUDE: Sin Sin = To miss God's mark

"All of us like sheep have gone astray, and each of us has turned to his own way." (Isaiah 53:6)

"If we say that we never sin, we are really only fooling ourselves, and refuse to accept the truth." (1 John 1:8)

Sin separates us from God and causes us to live our lives outside of His will.

"All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

When our relationship to God isn't right, it causes problems in every area of our lives – marriage, career, relationships, finances, etc.

What is the Solution?

The answer is found in a person – Jesus!

Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except through me!" (John 14:6)

God Himself came to earth as a human being to bring us back to Himself and enable us to live the God-centered lives He created us to live.

The Good News: Although your sin has separated you from God, Jesus has taken care of your sin problem!

"The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

What does God want me to do?

"If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23)

You can take these steps by praying a simple prayer of commitment. It might be like this:

Dear Jesus, thank you for creating me and loving me, even when I've ignored you and gone my own way. I realize I need you in my life and I'm sorry for my sins. I desire now to turn away from my sins. I ask you to forgive me. Thank you for dying on the cross for my forgiveness and for your gift of salvation that is forever because you rose from the dead. I desire to follow you daily. Please come into my life and make me a new person inside. I now receive you as my Lord and Savior.

Kiokee Baptist Church was founded in the spring of 1772 by pioneer preacher and church planter, **Daniel Marshall.** The word "Kiokee" was a term common to Cherokee and Creek Indians. It meant sweet or drinkable. We are Georgia's oldest **Baptist Church.**

Kiokee was a leader in the founding of several Baptist organizations and churches including:

- The Georgia Baptist Association in 1784
- The Georgia Baptist Convention in 1822
- The Southern Baptist Convention in 1845

Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is one with the Father. Jesus was born of a virgin, lived a sinless human life, and offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice for our sin by dying on a cross. He arose from the dead after three days to demonstrate His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven's glory and will return again someday to earth to reign as King of kings and Lord of lords.

• About The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is one with the Father and the Son. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He also lives in every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. He gives every believer a spiritual gift, or gifts, when they are saved. As Christians, we seek to live under His guidance daily.

About the Bible

The Bible is God's Word to us. Human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit, wrote it. It is the supreme source of Truth for Christian beliefs and living. Because it is inspired by God, it is Truth without any mixture of error.

Who We Are Our Faith

About Human Beings

People are created in the image of God to be like Him in character. People are the supreme object of God's creation. Although every person has tremendous potential for good, all of us are marred by sin that separates us from God and causes many problems in life.

About Salvation

Salvation is God's free gift to us. It must, however, be accepted. We can never make up for our sin by self-improvement or good works. Only by surrender to Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness, can anyone be saved from sin's penalty. When we turn from our self-ruled life and turn to Jesus in faith, we are saved. Eternal life with God begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into his life by faith.

About Eternal Security

Because God gives us eternal life through Jesus Christ, the true believer is secure in that salvation for eternity. If you have been genuinely saved, you cannot lose it. Salvation is maintained by the grace and power of God, not by the self-effort of the Christian. It is the grace and keeping power of God that gives us this security.

About Eternity

People were created to exist forever. We will either exist eternally separated from God by sin, or eternally with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally separated from God is hell. To be eternally in union with Him is eternal life. Heaven and hell are real places of existence.

Our Affiliations

- The Georgia Baptist Mission Board
 3,400 churches that fellowship together with the goal of evangelizing our state
- The Southern Baptist Convention
 40,000 churches that cooperate together in a worldwide effort of missions

What is the Southern Baptist Convention?

- It is the largest association of Christian churches in Georgia and in America.

 One out of every ten churches in America is affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention.
- It is the most diverse association of churches.

 SBC churches include every race, nationality, and ethnic group. Each Sunday, services are held in over 80 languages in the U.S. One out of every three black churches in the U.S. is Southern Baptist.
- It is one of the fastest growing groups in the U.S.

 As a whole, SBC churches baptize an average of over 1,000 new believers a day in the U.S. and begin almost 5 new churches a day!

Why not just be an independent church?

We are an independent church. Every SBC church is completely independent. There is no denominational control or hierarchy, as there is in most denominations. Each church is self-governed and determines its own affairs. For example:

- Every SBC church chooses its own pastor and staff
- Every SBC church owns its buildings
- Every SBC church determines its own budget

What are the advantages of affiliation with the SBC?

What is a Disciple?

We use head, heart, and hands to help us understand this definition. Each of these words illustrates a key aspect of discipleship.

"Follow me" (Head)

Disciples follow Jesus. He leads; we follow. We make a deliberate decision to change the direction of our lives and follow Him.

"I will make you" (Heart)

Disciples welcome the process of being changed by Jesus. Through this process of sanctification, Jesus transforms our character to be more like His.

"Fishers of men" (Hands)

Disciples commit themselves to the mission of Jesus. A disciple wants to help others know about who Christ is and what it means to follow Him.

- Being changed by Jesus
- · Committed to the mission of Jesus







Making Disciples of Jesus

How does one become a Disciple?

Using head, heart, and hands will also help us understand three key *components* of the discipleship process. We desire for every member of Kiokee to commit to include each of these elements in their life.

There are three key components:

Group — **Getting to Know God through the Study of His Word**

Each disciple needs a time during which they learn more about the Lord as He reveals Himself through His word. As a result, we offer Discipling Groups to help followers of Jesus learn more about the Bible.

Corporate Worship — Offering our Love and Praise to God through Corporate Worship The Bible also stresses the importance of the Church to gather for Corporate Worship. Our desire is for each person at Kiokee to "Declare the Greatness of God" together in Corporate Worship. We offer two Worship Services on Sunday morning for our people to offer praise and glory to God.

Ministry — Offering our Time, Talents, and Gifts to the Lord through Service in Ministry Growth in our relationship with Jesus happens as we spend time working out the truth we're learning by serving in ministry. We encourage each member of Kiokee to find an area in which to serve. There are multiple opportunities to find a place to plug in here on campus, or you can move past the walls of the church and serve the Lord in our community.

How is discipleship an extension of our mission statement?

What It Means To Be A Member

The difference between attenders and members can be summed up in one word: **commitment!**

At Kiokee we recognize the need for a formal membership. We ask you to commit to membership for four reasons:

A Biblical Reason: Christ is committed to the church.

"...Christ loved the church, and gave Himself up for her." (Ephesians 5:25)

A Cultural Reason: It is the *antidote* to our society.

We live in an age where very few want to be committed to anything. This attitude has produced a generation of "church shoppers and hoppers." Membership swims against the current of America's "consumer religion." It is an unselfish decision. Commitment builds character.

A Practical Reason: It defines who can be *counted* on.

Every team has a roster. Every school has an enrollment. Membership identifies our family.

A <u>Spiritual</u> Reason: It produces *maturity*.

The New Testament places an emphasis on the need for believers to be accountable to each other for spiritual growth. You cannot be accountable when you're not committed to any specific church family.

Kids Ministry

At Kiokee, we are working together with a common vision to declare the greatness of God to the next generation by loving and reaching children/families and making disciples of Jesus.

We want this generation and every generation to come to declare our God great and learn to set their hope in Him and Him alone. As parents and leaders in the church, we have the unique opportunity to partner with each other to be the two greatest influences in a child's life.

It is our desire to partner with you and together help all children be able to look back on their early life and say "...my life was significantly impacted by my parents and church."



The Role of the Parent:

We believe that the Bible tasks parents with the primary responsibility of nurturing the faith of their child. In Deuteronomy chapter 6, parents are instructed to teach their children "diligently" to fear the Lord their God and to walk in His ways, keeping His statutes and commands, enjoying a long life. In every aspect of their day, whether they are sitting at home, walking along the road, lying down or rising (vs. 7) parents have the wonderful opportunity to talk to their children about God and His Word and help their children learn to view all of life through the lens of Scripture.

The Role of Kid's Ministry:

We believe that from birth children need to hear about the greatness of God. It is our desire to be intentional in how we minister to children of all ages. We want to lay spiritual foundations in the lives of kids. While we strive to provide a safe environment at Kiokee and desire that your kids have a great time and enjoy what they participate in, our over-arching goal is to introduce each child to Christ and make disciples of Jesus.

Worship

Worship at Kiokee Kids provides an atmosphere for kids of all ages to come together and discover some big truths directly from the scripture. Nursery

Sunday Discipleship classes provide an opportunity for kids to dive into the Word with kids their own age. Utilizing age appropriate curriculum, teachers share about our great God and how He can transform the lives of all who place their trust in Him.

Midweek Ministry

Midweek provides an opportunity for kids to have fun and get to know their peers while participating in Bible studies designed just for them. Wednesdays also provide the space for kids to learn about missions in their community and around the world!

Nursery

Nursery care is provided for our youngest friends in our babies and toddler classes.

First Steps

First Steps provides an opportunity for children who have turned 2-3 years old by September 1st of the current ministry year to begin learning about basic Bible stories and mission opportunities.

Team Kids

Team Kids is a ministry designed for kids in K4 and Kindergarten where stories from the Old and New Testament are taught along with an introduction to North American and International Missionaries.

GAs

GAs is a ministry for girls in 1st-5th Grades. Each year the girls focus on a different area of scripture, identifying how the Bible relates to their everyday lives. GAs also provides opportunities for girls to participate in local mission projects, discovering their role in God's plan.

RAs

RAs is a ministry for boys in 1st-5th Grades. Boys have the opportunity to learn about becoming godly young men by diving into the Word and participating in hands on activities aimed at training them to become spiritual leaders.



Declaring the Greatness of God Through Our Students

Our goal is to be intentional and strategic in everything that we do in the Student Ministry. We want every aspect of our youth group to have the purpose of declaring, demonstrating, and discipling. Practically, we carry this out by discipling our students in small groups, expanding their biblical literacy, engaging them with service and mission-centered opportunities, and much more.

We do not want to shelter our students from culture or water down the gospel. Rather, we strive to train them to respond to culture by equipping them with God's Word.

Additionally, we want the focus of the Student Ministry to be completely about Jesus. To elaborate, we want kids to grow in their love of Jesus, not in their love of youth group. Yes, we still want kids to love youth group, but we want them to keep coming back because of Jesus, not because of hype. Don't get us wrong, we take fun VERY seriously. The Gospel is the best news ever and deserves to be celebrated. We never want to bore a student with the Gospel, we want to keep everyone engaged in fun and in relationship with one another.

SUNDAYS

We offer Sunday Discipling Groups for Students on Sunday Mornings at 9 AM.

Occasionally, our Student Ministry will have "Breakfast Sunday." These are scheduled on our Student Ministry Calendar in advance. During Breakfast Sunday, students will have food at 9 AM in the Café and then gather in D106 (main youth room) and sit at tables with their small groups. We will play games, have a lesson taught, and answer some discussion questions at tables.

Our groups are organized as follows:

Middle School Boys - D101 | Middle School Girls - D104 | High School Boys - D102 | High School Girls - D108

Here's a glance of our Scope and Sequence for Sunday Discipling Groups:

Middle School (6th-8th): Biblical Literacy Core: The Foundation Series by YM360
High School (9th-12th): Apologetics, Biblical Manhood/Womanhood, Taking Ownership of Your Faith, Discipleship 101, Life Younique, etc.



What goes on for students at Kiokee on Wednesday Nights?

During the school year, we offer a student Worship Service known as "Midweek." This service takes place in Building D (which is the old school buildings up on the hill behind the church to the right). Midweek lasts from 6:15-7:30 PM, with our doors opening around 6 PM.

What actually happens during Midweek?

- Midweek is designed for students to hang out with friends, participate in worship, play games, be challenged with a
 message from our Student Pastor, and engage with one another in small groups! We choose our content for Midweek
 based on topical things happening in culture, as well as studies through books of the Bible and studies of people in the
 Bible.
- Small groups do not occur every Wednesday. Typically, we have small groups a few times during our current sermon series. For example, if we have a 5-week sermon series, we will probably have two small group nights during that 5-week period. Small group nights largely depend on the current series we're studying. If we feel that the series needs more small group nights, then we'll adjust accordingly.
- We also have special Midweek nights called "Midweek Mash-Up." During these nights, we have a time of worship and testimonies given by students and leaders. We eat together and have several game options to play. "Mash-Up" nights usually occur between sermon series.
- Other special Midweek events include Missions Night, Thanksmas, Night of Worship, and the Humphrey Awards.

Frequently Asked Questions

It's my first time. What if I don't know anybody?

No worries, chances are that there is someone here from your school that you probably know. We have students from most schools in Columbia County and the surrounding areas, including public, private, Christian, and homeschooling.

Where is Building D?

Building D is located behind the church, up the hill to the right. It's an old elementary school that has been renovated into our Student Building. It's where we do our Discipling Groups and Midweek Service.

What else do you have for Students besides Sundays and Midweek?

Our Student Website is the best place to look at all our current student activities. You'll find stuff like:

- HS Hangtime/MS Chilltime/Student Hangout (MS and HS combined):
 These are laid-back, low-cost activities for students. We do movie nights, Nerf battles, bowling, TopGolf, dodgeball, kickball, and much more!
- o Kingdom Weekend (DNOW): This is a weekend-long event where we have worship and do activities with other churches in the CSRA. Our students stay at host homes in their small groups during the weekend.
- Retreat: Our retreats are usually overnight trips that take place over a few days. Sometimes we go to places with our "Kingdom Weekend" churches, or it'll just be Kiokee students at the Retreat.
- o IMPACT CAMP: This is the most exciting summer camp your student will ever attend! IMPACT is usually the first full week of June and a for-sure event you don't want to miss.
- Mission Trips: Kiokee has built up mission partnerships all over. We tend to stick to a mission trip model of Jerusalem,
 Judea, Samaria, and Ends of the Earth. We rotate mission trips based on distance. For example, we may do a 4 year rotation of Clarkston, GA, and the CSRA; Boston, MA; Anchorage, AK; and Costa Rica.

Creating a welcoming environment for all

As a member of our Guest Services Team, you will help create a comfortable environment for our guests so they can be open to hear the truth of God's word and respond in obedience. We exist to declare the greatness of God as He transforms lives by loving and reaching people and making disciples of Jesus. Our team loves and reaches people by welcoming, informing, and serving each guest that comes to our church with the prayer that they, too, will become disciples of Jesus.

Whether they've discovered us on the web, been invited by a friend, or just up and decided to visit that big church they pass on the way to work everyday, each Sunday is someone's first Sunday here at Kiokee. When they arrive, we want them to feel welcome, valued, and prepared for. When they get home, we want them to feel glad that they came and excited to come back. But ultimately, we want to create an environment where they are open to the leading of the Holy Spirit as God's Word is preached and as His people gather for Worship.

Team Roles:

- Greeters Great each guest (and regular attender) enthusiastically. Show them you are glad they are here. Smile. Make eye contact. Be enthusiastic. Door holders, mom assisters, guest reassurers...
- Connect Table Welcome those who come to the table before or after the service. Give Welcome Bags to first-time guests, get basic contact information, direct them to kiokee.org, and invite them back. Your job is to specifically care for and connect with our newest attendees.
- Ushers Actively look for guests to assist and politely ask if they have a seating preference and do the best you can to accommodate their request. Rather than direct or point, walk with them to their seat.
- Welcome Center Welcome guests as they approach the Welcome Center. Assist them by answering questions about Discipling Groups, Wednesday Nights, Children's Ministry, Student Ministry, etc. Be willing to walk with them to their destination.
- **Coordinator** Point Person for our team. Provide leadership, coaching, and communication to team members. Handle logistics for Sundays. Communicate with team members and team leaders about schedule. Help spot and troubleshoot issues as they arise.
- Sunday / Service Team Leader Lead pre-service muster. Make sure all spots are covered. Keep team members updated on room changes, church-wide emphases, or special events. Identify church members who could serve on our team. Fill in for vacant spots. Help troubleshoot aspects of our guests' experience.

Opportunities To Serve

Preschool Ministry

Discipling Group Teacher or Assistant

Prepares a Bible lesson and activities that reinforce the Bible truths taught in the lesson. Serves weekly with a co-teacher.

Worship Hour Leader or Assistant

Prepares a follow-up summary of the Bible lesson and activities to reinforce the Bible truth. Serves once a month during the Second Service.

Facilitator

Responsible for overseeing the Preschool area as they assist and/or equip parents and leaders with the check-in process, classroom supplies, etc. Serves once a month during Discipling Groups or the Second Service.

Kids Ministry

Discipling Group Teacher or Assistant

Prepares a Bible lesson and activities that reinforce the Bible truths taught in the lesson. Serves weekly with a co-teacher.

Kids Worship Leader or Assistant

Collaborates with a team that plans and leads a time of praise and Worship, Bible teaching and activities that reinforce the Bible truth for the day. Serves once a month during the Second Service throughout the school calendar year.

Wednesday Leader or Assistant - GAs, RAs, Team Kids

Collaborates with a team that plans and leads a time of bible teaching as well as games and activities that reinforce the Bible truth for the day. Serves once a week on Wednesday evenings throughout the school calendar year.

Special Needs Ministry Leader or Assistant

Loves and cares for children with various disabilities that may not allow them to participate in regular ministry activities. Serves once a month during Discipling Groups or the Second Service.

Student Ministry

Discipling Group Leader

Our Sunday Discipling Groups are formatted in a way that emphasizes engaging discussion. There are two main tasks that we strive to accomplish in our Sunday Discipling Groups: Teaching and Shepherding. Leaders have the freedom to share the teaching responsibility week to week, but don't feel like you must be a "teacher" in order to be a leader in our Discipling Groups. We also need great "shepherds" that care for the inward needs of the group. Shepherding responsibilities can include: reaching out to inactive students, communicating with students during the week, visiting students during the week at their extracurriculars, organizing times for serving together and fellowshipping together. Successful shepherding is "doing life together" with students and their families.

Midweek Leader

Midweek Leaders share the same responsibility of helping teach and shepherd our students, but the environment is more of a "high-energy" feel. A Midweek Leader is not a chaperone - they are engaged in the same things that the students are doing at the Midweek Service. This can include: participating in games, facilitating table discussion, listening to the lesson and taking notes, engaging in Worship, and more. On small group nights, leaders will guide discussion from a provided lesson.

Tech Leader

Music and video is of high value to this generation. Serving as a Tech Leader is an important part of our Student Ministry. We need someone who is willing to be trained on our simple software to help run the video portion of our Wednesday Night experience. We are also in need of those who are willing to be trained on our sound board as well.

General Expectations:

Meet Kiokee's safety and security requirements of Background Check and Minor Protection Training. Faithful member of Kiokee: including active participation in Worship, a Discipling Group, and in your area of service. Hard worker with a flexible attitude and teachable spirit. Must go through "on-board" training process to be a Leader in the Student Ministry.
